### LUÍS NUNO RODRIGUES



Academic director of Global Challenges. Full Professor at the Department of History of ISCTE-IUL, where he coordinates the graduate programme on History, Defense and International Relations, Luís Rodrigues is the Director of the Center for International Studies, CEI-IUL. He is also the Editor of the Portuguese Journal of Social Science. In 2006 and 2008, he was visiting professor at Brown University, USA. A former Fulbright student, Luís Rodrigues holds a PhD in American History from the University of Wisconsin, Madison, USA, and a Master's degree on Portuguese 20th Century History, at Universidade Nova, Lisbon. He has published several articles and books in Portugal and abroad. The Portuguese version of his PhD Dissertation, on Portuguese - American relations during the J. F. Kennedy Administration, was published in 2002 and won two national prizes in Portugal. His most recent book is a collective volume on worldwide perceptions of NATO, six decades after its creation.

### FERNANDO JORGE CARDOSO



Executive coordinator of Global Challenges. Head of Strategic and Development Studies of the Instituto Marquês de Valle Flôr, Executive Director of the Lisbon Club, he is also an Integrated Researcher at CEI-IUL. Fernando Cardoso got his PhD (1991) and Public Habilitations (2006) from ISEG-UL. In Mozambique, he was Dean of the School of Economics of the Eduardo Mondlane University (1978-1983), Advisor to the Minister of Planning (1977-1983) and CEO of Maragra, a sugar company (1983-1985). In Portugal he carried out research, education and management activities in several University institutions. Cardoso was head of the Africa Programme of the Institute for Strategic and International Studies, IEEI (1991-2012). As a consultant, he elaborated /evaluated aid programmes in Angola, Mozambique and Cape Verde. He was copresident of the Organising Committee of the Estoril Conferences (2009, 2011). He has an extensive list of publications on African, Development and International Relations.

## SPEAKERS, FACULTY BIOS

### ANDRÉ FREIRE



Full Professor and Director of the Political Science Doctorate of ISCTE-IUL. He is also Senior Researcher at CIES-IUL. Formerly he was Director of the BA in Political Science (2009-2015). He has led various research projects on ideology, elites and people, electoral behaviour and political attitudes, institutions and political reform and political representation. He published extensively on these subjects, having more than 100 articles in academic reviews, 37 books and book chapters. Freire was pioneer in electoral studies in Portugal. Freire participates in several international research networks, including *Comparative Study of Electoral Systems*, *European Value Study*, *European Election Study*, *True European Voter*, *European Candidate Study*, *PARTIREP – Party Representation*, *PARENEL – Parliamentary Representation at the National and European Levels*, *Comparative Candidate Study*. He belongs to the *Comparative Candidate Study Steering Committee*. He is a regular contributor to the published press and has an extensive work as consultant for various bodies on high level research and education.

### LUÍS AMADO



Chairman of the General and Supervision Board of EDP (Electric Power Company) since 2018. He was Invited Titular Professor at the Institute for Social and Political Sciences (ISCSP-UL), Member of the Strategic Council of the Lisbon Club he was until recently its first President of the Board. Luís Amado held several positions in the Portuguese Government since the 1990s, including Secretary of State Adjunct for Home Affairs, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation (1995-1997 and 1999-2002), Minister of Defence (2005-2006) and Minister of State and Foreign Affairs (2006-2011). He was representative at the Regional Assembly of Madeira and member of the Portuguese Parliament. He was non-executive Chairman of BANIF. Luís Amado graduated in Economics at the Technical University of Lisbon. He was international consultant, adviser to the National Defence Institute (IDN) and Visiting Professor at Georgetown University.

### JOSÉ MANUEL FÉLIX RIBEIRO



Advisor of the Board of the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation and Invited Fellow of the Portuguese Institute for International Relations, IPRI-UNL. He is also Vice-President of the Supervisory Board of the Lisbon Club. Félix Ribeiro worked in several government departments of studies, prospective and planning from 1973 to 2012, including the Group of Basic Studies of Industrial Economics, the Service of Studies and Planning of the National Unit of Scientific and Technological Research. He was Deputy-General Director of the Department of Prospective and Planning where he worked from 1995 to 2006, being responsible for International Information and Prospective issues. He carried on several studies and published several articles on international economics, prospective studies and development strategies. He got a BA in Economics at ISCEF in 1971 and a PhD in

International Relations at the School of Social Sciences and Humanities of the Lisbon Nova University in 2012.

#### CATARINA ROSETA PALMA



She is Assistant Professor at ISCTE-IUL. Her main research interests and activities are related with environmental and natural resource economics, especially in the areas of water management, behavioural models, uncertainty, and growth. She has several publications in the aforementioned areas. She has taught Environmental Economics, Public Economics, and Microeconomics at the undergraduate as well as the graduate levels, and she has coordinated a graduate degree in Corporate Sustainability. Catarina Roseta Palma is the Vice-president of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists. She worked with the Instituto da Água (INAG), the Portuguese Water Authority, on the implementation of the economic aspects of the Water Framework Directive in Portugal. She has also worked as a consultant for the Portuguese Environment Ministry, the European Commission and the River Basin Authorities of the Provinces of Alentejo and Algarve.

#### NUNO ANTUNES



Partner of Miranda & Associados, he is an expert in law of the sea, working mainly on oil and gas. Previously (2006), he was Legal Adviser to the Prime Minister of Timor-Leste for the petroleum sector. He was Legal Coordinator of the Portuguese Task Group for the Extension of the Continental Shelf, expert to the Portuguese Strategic Commission on the Oceans, and currently integrates the arbitrators' list of the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea. He taught Public International Law and Constitutional Law and is a regular speaker in Post-Graduation courses and conferences. Nuno Antunes holds a BA in Naval Military Sciences from the Portuguese Naval Academy, a BA in Law from the University of Lisbon, and he also got a MA and a PhD from the University of Durham, UK. He has authored a number of books and articles, among them "Towards the Conceptualisation of Maritime Delimitation: Legal and Technical Aspects of a Political Process", Brill, 2003.
